JOB TITLE: Health Education Program Coordinator

REPORTS TO: Chief Operating Officer (COO)

JOB SUMMARY: This full-time position is responsible for coordinating all efforts within Health Education, (non-federally funded) at HFTX.

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:

- Coordinates and plans implementation, and evaluation of assigned education programs
- Monitors progress towards grant implementation goals and objectives that comply with organizations plans and vision, including assuring collection of relevant data and producing relevant reports in a timely manner
- In coordination with direct Supervisor, develops and manages budgets for education programs
- Engages with leadership team in complex planning scenarios
- Assists in writing, developing and applying for grants to help support the health education program
- Supervises, orients, manages, and recruits assigned staff, interns, and volunteers
- Monitors employee productivity and provides constructive feedback and coaching
- Plans and conducts trainings in facilitating curricula and other subject matter related to sexual health education
- Identifies and coordinates community engagement efforts
- Responsible for qualifying and pursuing new partnerships for programming
- Collaborates with schools, agencies, and organizations to build and nurture long-term professional relationships
- Escalating and resolving areas of concern as raised by partners
- Facilitates and delivers group presentations on teen and unplanned pregnancy prevention, adolescent health, and related topics
- Represents HFTX in the community in a professional manner
- Remains current on topics related to abstinence, contraception, STI's, reproductive health and adolescent health
- Performs other related duties and fulfills responsibilities as assigned

- Demonstrated strong skills in developing and maintaining working relationships with community leaders, parents, youth, and school district personnel
- Demonstrated ability to partner with school districts, community organizations, and other

stakeholders in an inclusive and participatory manner

- Demonstrated ability to work independently and as a team member with minimal supervision
- Ability to troubleshoot and use critical thinking in high pressure situations
- Strong interpersonal and leadership skills
- Self-motivated, organized, flexible, adaptive, detail-oriented, and creative
- Strong verbal and written communication skills
- Demonstrated ability to relate to people of varied ethnicities, ages, backgrounds, and abilities
- Demonstrated ability to identify training needs and provide community partners with feedback and technical assistance, as needed
- Proficient computer skills in MS Office is required
- Must be willing/able to work evenings and weekends as assigned
- Must have cell phone, with text messaging and work e-mail access
- Proficient in social media platforms, such as Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, Instagram, and Google

- Demonstrated ability to lead a small team or department

- Certified Health Education Specialist (CHES) certification, or AASECT certification
- Working knowledge of teen pregnancy prevention, adolescent health, and positive youth development

- Demonstrated ability to relate to students of varied ethnicity, ages, backgrounds, and abilities
- Experience in working with school districts and/or community agency administrative level staff
- Bilingual (English and Spanish)
